


According to our participants, COMMUNITY FOOD SECURITY involves:

- Working for justice and equity



Components identified as potential leverage points for food system enhancement are shown in green, Whole Measures indicators in blue or yellow, Community Capitals in bold black.





probe – sense - respond

emergent practice

Complicated

the relationship between cause and effect requires analysis or some other form of investigation and/or the application of expert knowledge sense – analyze - respond good practice

DISORDER

novel practice

no relationship between cause and effect at systems level

act – sense -respond

best practice

the relationship between cause and effect is obvious to all
