that the hay classes have changed from years past. Section I will include only completely field-cured hay, and Section II will include heat or mechanical drying, as well as added hay preservatives.

Additional classes have been added to showcase the diversity of hay grown in Pennsylvania and expand the educational value of the show.

All members of the Pennsylvania Forage and Grassland Council can enter any number of samples without a charge. All other non-member exhibitors will be charged \$10/sample. Entry fees must accompany hay samples. CREDIT CARDS WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED. Must have check or cash.

SECTION I

Field Cured (no heat or hay preservatives)

Class 1 Alfalfa - First Cutting

Alfalfa from stands at least one year old with *not* over 10 percent grasses

Class 2 Alfalfa - Later Cutting

Alfalfa with *not* over 10 percent grasses

Class 3 Alfalfa-Grass Mixed - First Cutting

A mixture of alfalfa and grass with *over 50% being alfalfa*

Class 4 Grass-Alfalfa Mixed - First Cutting

A mixture of alfalfa and grass with *over 50% being grass*

Class 5 Alfalfa-Grass Mixed - Later Cutting

A mixture of alfalfa and grass with *over 50% being alfalfa*

Class 6 Grass-Alfalfa Mixed - Later Cutting

A mixture of alfalfa and grass with *over 50% being grass*

Class 7 Clover

Clover with *not* over 20 percent grasses

Class 8 Clover - Grass Mixed – Any cutting

A mixture of clover and grass with *not* over 50 percent grasses

Class 9 Orchardgrass - First cutting

Pure species at least 90% Orchardgrass

Class 10 Timothy – First cutting

Pure species at least 90% Timothy

Class 11 Other Species Grass – First cutting

Pure species (e.g. brome, fescue, etc) at least 90%

Class 12 Mixed Grass – First Cutting

A mixture of 2 or more grass species, must be 90% grass

Class 13 Grass – Later Cutting

Must be 90% grass

SECTION II

Heat or Mechanically Dried or with Preservatives

Class 21 Alfalfa - First Cutting

Alfalfa from stands at least one year old with *not* over 10 percent grasses

Class 22 Alfalfa - Later Cutting

Alfalfa with *not* over 10 percent grasses

Class 23 Alfalfa-Grass Mixed - First Cutting

A mixture of alfalfa and grass with *over 50% being alfalfa*

Class 24 Grass-Alfalfa Mixed - First Cutting

A mixture of alfalfa and grass with *over 50% being grass*

Class 25 Alfalfa-Grass Mixed - Later Cutting

A mixture of alfalfa and grass with *over 50% being alfalfa*

Class 26 Grass-Alfalfa Mixed - Later Cutting

A mixture of alfalfa and grass with *over 50% being grass*

Class 27 Clover

Clover with *not* over 20 percent grasses

Class 28 Clover - Grass Mixed – Any cutting

A mixture of clover and grass with *not* over 50 percent grasses

Class 29 Orchardgrass - First cutting

Pure species at least 90% Orchardgrass

Class 30 Timothy – First cutting

Pure species at least 90% Timothy

Class 31 Other Species Grass – First cutting

Pure species (e.g. brome, fescue, etc) at least 90%

Class 32 Mixed Grass – First Cutting

A mixture of 2 or more grass species, must be 90% grass

Class 33 Grass – Later Cutting

Must be 90% grass

Hay Show Location – Inside the Harrington Building at the end of East 5th Street. Hay samples delivered to Ag Progress Days on Tuesday; August 10 should be dropped off at the special HAY SAMPLE DROP OFF POINT located along the East entrance to Ag Progress Days. Deadline for sample delivery is 10:00 a.m. on August 10.

PREMIUMS

Premiums will be awarded for the first five places in each class as follows:

- 1st - \$20.00 plus ribbon and forage analysis
- 2nd - \$15.00 plus ribbon and forage analysis
- 3rd - \$10.00 plus ribbon and forage analysis
- 4th - \$5.00 plus ribbon and forage analysis
- 5th - \$3.00 plus ribbon and forage analysis

All exhibitors will receive a forage analysis from every sample entered.

RULES

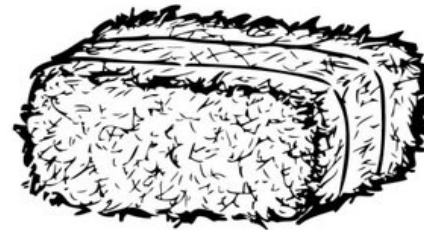
1. Entries officially close at 10:00 a.m., Tuesday, August 10, 2021. However, to facilitate handling of samples, exhibitors are urged to deliver their samples to the Harrington Building on Tuesday, August 10. Hay shipped or delivered prior to August 1 should be clearly identified as Hay Show Sample and addressed as follows:

2. **All members of the Pennsylvania Forage and Grassland Council can enter any number of samples without a charge. All other non-member exhibitors will be charged \$10/sample. Entry fees must accompany hay samples.**
3. The hay shown must have been grown by the Exhibitor in Pennsylvania in 2021.
4. Exhibitors may enter in as many classes as they wish, **but no exhibitor shall have more than one entry in a class**, either in his own name, the name of the farm, or the name of some other person.
5. Exhibitors must attach an entry blank, giving name, address, county and class in which, the exhibit is to be entered. Exhibitors can secure additional entry blanks at their County Agricultural Extension Office.
6. LONG HAY FROM ANY BALES (small square, large round or large square) THAT HAVE BEEN CURED (adequately dry) can be entered. **An exhibit must consist of a bale section 4 to 6 inches thick, 12 inches high and 18 inches wide.** Thin or moist samples will be disqualified.
7. **SAMPLES MUST BE TIED WITH TWINE.**
8. Judging will be based on both visual characteristics and forage quality analysis.
9. Unless disapproved by the exhibitor, samples will be stored for exhibit in the Hay Show at the 2021 Pennsylvania Farm Show. To receive cash prizes from the Farm Show you must provide them with your Social Security Number. Mail the attached tear-off tab directly to the Farm Show.

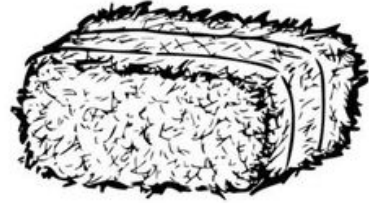
