

Local driving directions from Rt. 322 Bypass (Mt. Nittany Expressway): Take the Boalsburg/Oak Hall Exit toward Boalsburg. At the first stop light, continue straight through the light onto Rt. 45 W (Shingletown Rd.) toward the village of Water Street. Travel approximately 4.5 miles and turn left at the stop sign onto Rt. 26/Rt. 45 W. At the flashing light in Pine Grove Mills, go straight and follow Rt. 45 W, driving approximately 5.5 miles to the Ag Progress Days site on the left.
