Educational initiative of the Victor Pinchuk Foundation, aimed at fostering a new generation of Ukrainian professional elites.

The Foundation will offer grants to young Ukrainians to pursue a Master's Degree in the world's best Universities in the fields selected by the Foundation as top priority for further development of Ukraine, i.e.:

Agricultural studies

Environment and ecology

Law

Public administration

Winners of an open nationwide competition will receive grants, based on the needs and merit assessment. The majority of grants shall cover up to 60% of the total amount required, up to USD 50.000 for the overall duration of study, 1-2 years. The grant will be used primarily to cover the University tuition fees, books and medical insurance.

To receive the grant, potential candidates should choose the Master's Degree program independently, go through the application process as per University requirements, and further explain to the WorldWideStudies Selection panel how he/she plans to apply the acquired knowledge in Ukraine. The Victor Pinchuk Foundation will expect all grant winners to return to Ukraine and work in the chosen field of study for at least 5 years.

- Aspire to study at the Master's program in one of the world's best Universities and in one of the 4 priority fields

Selection Panel

The Selection Panel will consist of the representatives of the major Ukrainian companies, recruiting agencies, analytical centers, embassies of the host countries and other bodies that will ensure impartiality and facilitate employment opportunities for the prospective candidates.
