Application Requirements

- Funding should be used for a program occurring within the next fiscal year.
- Applications are considered only for undergraduate and graduate international embedded courses.
- Applications must be turned in by 5:00pm on August 25. Decisions will typically be made within one week of the deadline.

Evaluation Criteria

Applications will be evaluated according to the following criteria:

- Degree to which the program will promote global competency of CAS students
- Degree to which the program will contribute to the goals of the college's strategic plan
- Student learning objectives clearly stated as they relate to internationalization
- Priority given to
 - Departments who have not previously offered an embedded international experience for a particular major
 - First time study location
 - First time coordinator of study experience
 - "Non-traditional" study experience locations or program models
- Matching funds are mandatory for award

Information for Recipients

- Recipients must contact Michelle Haagen, (814) 863-0249, mjh36@psu.edu within 30 days of award notification with the name of their financial officer and appropriate budget/fund number for transfer of funds.
- If the trip must be postponed, funds are not guaranteed for future trip, and if the trip must be cancelled, funds must be returned to the Office of International Programs within 30 days of cancellation.
- Travel to countries with U.S. State Department Travel Warnings must be in compliance with Penn State's travel policies. The award from the travel fund does not replace any requirements pursuant to those travel policies.
- Administration of the CAS Embedded Course Pre-Course and Post-Trip on-line Survey to participating students is required for fund awardees.
