Case Study: Bladder Stones

History:

- 3 yr old long-haired intact female Chihuahua
- Frequent urination and hematuria over several days
- Otherwise acting normally and no prior history of any serious health concerns

Presentation:

- · Quiet/shy, but alert and responsive
- · Urinated on floor during exam
 - Grossly hematuric urine
- Physical exam was normal except for mild dental calculus and on abdominal palpation a hard, smooth object noted in the caudal abdomen

Diagnostic Tests:

- Urinalysis: Positive for bacteria, leukocytes and erythrocytes. pH 6.0. No crystalluria noted
- Abdominal radiographs: large, oval mineral readpacity object in caudal abdomen, consistent with a urolith.



Treatment:

- Surgical removal recommended, but client could not afford at the time
- Prescribed amoxicillin-clavulanic acid 62.5 mg BID PO for two weeks and Royal Canin Urinary S/O diet
- · Owner told to observe her closely and recheck when antiboitics finished

Second Presentation:

- Lethargic, difficulty defecating and urinating, and discomfort
- Hospitalized for the day and showed signs of dysuria, but not anuric

Diagnostic Tests:

- Chemistry Profile: WNL
- CBC: Increased leukocytes, otherwise WNL

Treatment:

- Large ballder stone suspected. Prescribed 12.5mg carprofen PO q24h while owner decided on further care
- Surgery was decided on
- Post-operative period and recovery were normal
