RE: Log a Load for Kids[®] Pennsylvania Campaign

Dear Friends:

I invite you to participate in the 2025 Log a Load for Kids[®] campaign – a statewide fundraising effort that the entire Forest Products Industry should be proud of – helping children overcome serious illnesses.

Log a Load for Kids is a nationwide campaign through which members of the forest products industry contribute to local Children's Miracle Network-affiliated hospitals to provide medical care to kids in need, regardless of their families' ability to pay.

Funds are used by the hospital's pediatric clinics for diagnostic equipment, special programs, to pay the hospital bills of uninsured children or treatments not covered by conventional insurance. The program has raised over \$50 million nationally over the past 35 years. Since our last Timber Show in 2023, this campaign in Pennsylvania has raised more than \$40,000 in support of Log a Load for Kids and the Children's Miracle Network.

Donors of \$100 or more will be invited to participate in a Truck and Equipment Parade and Check Presentation Ceremony at the Timber 2025 Forest Products Technology and Equipment Exposition at 2710 W. Pine Grove Road, Pennsylvania Furnace, PA on Friday, June 6. Eligibility for the parade has been expanded to welcome **all rubber tire equipment without tire chains and trucks hauling any type of forest product**. Report time for **all vehicles** will be 10:30 a.m. inside Gate J along the gravel road at the show site, to enable all participants to proceed around the show grounds to the Ceremony.

Each vehicle entered is eligible to have a promotional photo taken at the parade's photo stage to share to your website and social media pages. Photos will be emailed to participants.

Those planning to participate in the Parade should RSVP to the PFPA office to reserve a space and get instructions on the event no later than May 30, 2025.
