Join Michael Friday and Amy Seidel for a tour of their newly established Greenbriar Farms

Michael and Amy found themselves in a situation where they needed to relocate the farm business and discovered that moving a farm is not an easy venture. In search of an affordable farm that would support the enterprises they wanted to incorporate into their farm business, Michael and Amy found a suitable fit at Greenbriar Farms. Soil types, growing conditions, market availability, customer base, and zoning influenced their decision.

Michael and Amy will describe the unique challenges they experienced while moving equipment and infrastructure, such as high tunnels. They will discuss how they established a farm store, certified kitchen and storage facility. They will explain their strategy to retain current customers, build new markets, and the factors that influenced their decision to discontinue other marketing outlets.

Participants will tour the farm and facilities, including the shop where handcrafted birdhouses and feeders are produced, the produce packing area, high and low tunnels, chicken house, and fields.
